
Star Quilt Blocks



LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD MEETING MINUTES
Monday, August 11, 2025, 7:00 pm at SDA Church, Lincoln, NE

President Vicky Skuodas called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

- Minutes from the July meeting were published in the Plain Print. Kathy Gore moved to approve the minutes and Rosalind Carr seconded. The minutes were approved.
- The Treasurers' report was also in the Plain Print. June Peterson moved to approve the Treasurers' report. Sue DeWitt seconded. The Treasurers' report was approved and remanded for audit.
- Vicky also announced that member Tammy Hensley has an exhibit of her quilts at the Unitarian Church of Lincoln, located at 6300 A St. People can view her show during office hours. Tammy's show will hang until the end of August.
- Newbies will meet next Monday, August 18th, at Walt Library.
- Cuddle Quilts delivered 453 quilts this year. Of that number, 132 went to Sleep In Heavenly Peace. They are thrilled with the quality and beauty of the quilts. Vicky thanked all who have participated in these two projects and encouraged members to keep donating. The year is not over yet!
- Vicky invited new member Barb Clonch to come up and select a fat quarter. Two visitors, Kia Nelson and Janet Duggan, were also invited to select a fat quarter.

President-Elect Liane Connelly gave announcements:

- The Guild's Quilt Show - "*Seasons of Stitching*"—is scheduled for October 25th. This is a free show, at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church at 6001 A St., across from Pius HS. Entry forms were included in the Plain Print. Two entries per person are allowed. Be sure to register!
- Challenge quilts are to answer the question "What does _____ mean to me?" Answers may be country, the flag, patriotism, etc. Quilts are to be from 25" to 30" on each side. These will be due next March.
- Mourning Hope Grief Center is looking for volunteers to help with sewing projects that will help participants remember their loved one. Machines and materials are provided. Dates and more information were included in the Plain Print.
- The Cottonwood Quilt Show will be held on October 2-4.
- Quilters Day Out for the NSQG—Region I will be held on September 6th at Calico Cottage in Hastings. More information can be found on the NSQG website.
- Global Quilt Connection is again hosting an All Star Sampler Platter with 18 amazing instructors. Saturday, September 27th, and Sunday, September 28th from 3 to 6 pm (eastern time) are the dates and times. The Guild will be hosting this event for our membership only. The video will be available for 7 days after the 28th. This allows you to watch the program at the day(s) and time(s) that works for you. An email will be sent to the membership with the access code. Handouts can be printed for future reference.
- As a reminder, please always check the information table at the back of the room.

Connie Soucie reported that:

- “After Shock: Long Shadow 2020” is one of two new exhibits at the Quilt Museum. There were a lot of political issues that happened in 2020 which are still affecting us today. This exhibit shows us not only what happened in 2020, but how it felt! Explicit language in this exhibit may be unsettling for some visitors. The second exhibit is “The Collector’s Eye: Luly Strass”. The first of her collection is of contemporary artists from 1976-1980. The second of her collection are over 40 quilts by Black Southern women. She sought out improvisation, asymmetry, and compositional clarity, with an approach rooted in an appreciation of American folk art.
- Art Market is November 14th and 15th in the Reception Hall at the Quilt Museum. Last year there were over 1,100 people who came to the Museum and admission was free. Sixteen artists are confirmed and the hope is to have 18. Connie gave examples of the types of art that will be available for purchase at the Art Market. She thanked the LQG for our support, donations, and contributions to the Friends of the Museum booth. Volunteers are needed both days to make Art Market successful again. Carolyn Kitterer is co-chair with Marilyn Johnson.
- One hundred percent of what is sold in the Friends booth goes to the International Quilt Museum. Donations are very important and volunteers are needed the help Monday-Thursday before Art Market opens on Friday. People are also needed to work at the Friends table during the Art Market. Please sign up to volunteer with Sheila Green in September and October.
- Donations can be brought to Guild meetings or to Carolyn or Marilyn’s homes. There will be a brightly colored flyer with that contact information. Carolyn listed items that are good sellers at Art Market: fat quarters, yard cuts, wool, yarn, complete kits, pin cushions, decorative items, and vintage pieces. Quilts and quilt tops are also popular. Connie added that over \$9,000 was collected and donated to the Quilt Museum last year. She said working before and during the Art Market is a lot of fun, but also a lot of work.
- Sheila talked about the many volunteer opportunities during the two-day Art Market. She has sign-up sheets by the Discover Nebraska table that lists time slots and positions. Job descriptions are on the second sheet. She urged people to check their calendars and to sign up!

Sheila also shared that the Modern Quilt Guild has an exhibit through September, at the Lux Center for the Arts. She urged people to visit the exhibit and reminded the group that there will be a reception with refreshments on First Friday, September 5th.

Natalie Cummings announced that \$154 dollars were collected at the Mini Raffle table. Natalie thanked everyone for their support by donating items and by buying tickets. Sheila Green donated a quilt book, fabric and a spool of thread which was won by Nanci Nathan. Vicky Skuodas donated a wall hanging which was won by Sandra Wade. Sandra Wade also won another wall hanging donated by Vicky and a gift certificate to the Calico House donated by Pam Wakeman. Another wall hanging was donated by Vicky, along with a ruler donated by Pat Kant, won by Lori Miller. Jaynee Wolfe also won a wall hanging by Vicky and a ruler by anonymous.

Tammy Hensley updated the Guild about the 250th Quilt. She thanked the people who

generously donated several blocks at the meeting. She said that another star block was added and is partially paper-pieced. She'll also update the 250th Quilt progress on the website.

Vice-president for Programs, Marty Link, reminded the group that there are only three more months left of the Guild year. In September, the workshop will be the fish. Special pencils will be used and no sewing machines will be needed. October's workshop will be how to make quilts from fabric panels. Kris Vierra will be here in November. Her workshop title is "Borders, Binding, and More".

Marty then introduced Catherine Redford. Her program was a power point showing floral quilts entitled "The Language of Flowers". Catherine's workshop will be on wool applique. Catherine was originally from England, but is an American citizen by choice.

After the program, the meeting was adjourned to show and tell. Among many wonderful quilts shown was a quilted coat made by Tammy Hensley. She had made it as a fund raiser for the Pinewood Bowl. The winner of the coat agreed to let Tammy use the coat in her one woman show.

LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD – Proposed Budget CHANGES for YE 11/30/26 Budget

RECEIPTS/INCOME Changes

E	Removed Silent Auction receipts of \$3000. Receipts from silent auctions are only possible when quilt fabric/supplies are donated so this budget does not predict receipts in that category. If donations are made and a silent auction is held, we will be excited by this unexpected income.
F	Isles fabric/book sales can be increased slightly based on past income trend.
G	Mini Raffle can be increased slightly based on past income trend.
H	The 250 Star Raffle Quilt is being made by membership and proceeds donated to a veterans organization.
J	Interest can be increased because of earned interest on CDs.

DISBURSEMENTS/EXPENSES Changes

6	Current board is planning a Semiquincentennial Celebration (United States' 250th birthday) with expenses to include a meal and other activities.
8	Previously called the "Webmaster" category. Proposing a new name of "Information Technology (IT)" that includes all of the following: Disbursing Plain Print: \$13/month * 12 months = \$156; Webpage services: \$28.85/mo * 12 mo = \$346.20 AV Support during meetings: \$45/month * 8 months = \$360; MoneyMinder software: \$205.25 yearly subscription
13	Discover Nebraska foresees reduction in expenses.
16	Has been a scholarship for textile studies and quilt-related research/programs. UNL has recently removed that program from their curriculum. Set budget at \$0 until we identify the possibility for another educational scholarship area.
17	Current board wants to plan activities during meetings to encourage member socialization such as cookies and other events.

LINCOLN QUILTERS GUILD – Proposed Budget for YE 11/30/27

RECEIPTS/INCOME Notes

A	Yearly dues: \$60 less \$10 discount if paid by 12/31; half year \$30. Calculation explanation for 180 members: assume approx. 85% of members utilize early bird discount (180 members * 85% * \$50 = \$7650) and 15% of members not utilizing discount (180 members * 15% * \$60 = \$1620).
B	Program/Workshop fees are set to defray costs (not to make a profit). Calculation: an average of \$40/workshop * 10 people * 8 classes = \$3200.
C	Visitor fees: \$5 for first visit and \$15 for every meeting attended thereafter.
D	Quilt Show in odd-numbered years. Based on results of the 2022 survey, it is assumed future quilt shows will focus on quilts & community rather than fundraising. Calculation explanation: Receipts = est. \$400 from free-will donations; Expenses = est. \$250 church use gratuity, printing/misc expenses.
E	Receipts from silent auctions are only possible when quilt fabric/supplies are donated so this budget does not predict receipts in that category. If donations are made and a silent auction is held, we will be excited by this unexpected income.
F	Isles Fabric/book sales. Calculation explanation: March 2025 receipts \$1560 - \$200 expense for tables and sales tax. Assumed similar for this year.
G	Calculation explanation: averaging \$110/month * 7 months = \$770.
H	Anticipating that a volunteer(s) will come forward to make this fundraising quilt.
I	Give to Lincoln Day and other donations to the guild. Assuming similar giving as in the past.
J	Interest from: Basic Business Checking account, Regular CD, Access CD.

DISBURSEMENTS/EXPENSES Notes

1	Assuming 8 programs and workshops. This amount includes: speaker program, workshop, travel expenses, lodging, food, misc expenses. We are proposing a decrease in this expense area. This allows creativity for alternate speaker ideas such as: using current membership for a speaker, asking a modern guild member to present, possibly having a speaker for a meeting but no workshop class the following day, a zoom speaker presentation for a meeting, etc.
2	Meeting room rent is \$230 per month * 8 months (we do not meet at church in June).
3	Workshop rent for IQM.
4	Resource room rent is \$25 per month for 12 months.
5	None anticipated.
6	Special events -- none projected in 2027 since there will be a celebration in the previous year.
7	Paid in 2025: 34.58/month = \$414.96 + \$100/year for annual policy renewal.
8	An itemized list of these IT expenses is listed in the Budget Changes Notes for the YE 2026 Budget.
9	Because most members purchase their own books or use digital resources, we no longer purchase new books for the library.
10	Includes expenses for organized new member activities to learn more about the Guild and develop connections and foster friendships.
11	Includes reimbursements of expenses for non-funded committee expenses.
12	The Cuddle Quilt committee is also making Sleep in Heavenly Peace donations. Add SHP to the budget category name.
13	Quilt related outreach to school age children. Propose no change.
14	Quilt related outreach through annual event at IQM co-sponsored with 2 other guilds. Propose no change.
15	Quilt related service projects for veterans. Propose slight increase.
16	Has been a scholarship for textile studies and quilt-related research/programs. UNL has recently removed that program from their curriculum. Set budget at \$0 until we identify the possibility for another educational scholarship area.
17	Added this category to include things like cookies or other special activities at guild meetings.


